Steve has served TAGD as an officer from 2011-2015 as Treasurer. (it may have actually been 3 terms - I am not sure) Steve was also very active in committee membership and service including the legislative committee, finance committee and Groundwater Summit planning committee. Steve was always willing to take whatever role he was asked to serve in. Steve's quiet demeanor and vast knowledge of groundwater management, groundwater production and groundwater regulation has benefited TAGD, the member districts and the State of Texas. Many times, Steve just got things done. No one asked, no one gave him an award or featured him in a news article. Steve just worked for the benefit of everyone as a mentor, a leader, and a friend. It was through Steve's expertise and leadership that GMA 1 was able to complete the joint planning process and produce the first Explanatory Report. This report's format is still being utilized in the joint planning efforts of GMA 1 as the basis of all subsequent reports. As Wade Oliver stated, "the work has already been done."

Please describe the nominee's distinguished achievement related to groundwater management and conservation in Texas:

Steve has worked in every facet of groundwater. His education and his work experience even his time in the oilfield led him to explore and develop his knowledge of groundwater, which then led to his work with the Edwards Aguifer Authority. It was at the EAA where he established a permit review process and enforcement program to allocate some of the most historic water rights in Texas. Steve has served 16 years as the General manager of the North Plains Groundwater Conservation District which is one of the largest GCDs in the state of Texas. Steve was vital in implementing newly adopted rules mandating the metering and reporting of groundwater use in the Ogallala when meters were not the norm. Steve was instrumental in developing and overseeing a demonstration program that shows how currently available water conservation technologies and irrigation management practices can reduce groundwater use and allow farmers to remain profitable and financially viable with restricted and diminishing groundwater resources. Steve and his board members believed it was the role of the groundwater conservation district to show producers *how* to save water, not just require that they do it. The Blue Legacy Award was given to the NPGCD in 2011 for the "200-12 Reduced Irrigation on Corn Project" dubbed the "200-12 Project." This was not the only award-winning conservation program Steve collaborated on. The Master Irrigator Program has taught best management practices to hundreds of irrigation operators in the Texas Panhandle. This program won the Texas Environmental Excellence Award for 2018 and has been duplicated in Colorado and other states. Steve just keeps working and has most recently dedicated his time and expertise to the Ogallala Project to Mitigate Flooding in the Missouri River Basin or other basins and increase water supplies in the Ogallala-High Plains Regional to ensure food security and economic stability. Steve's unwavering work has helped build the foundation of groundwater management practices and law in Texas.
